## SCHOOL AND ALUMNI NOTES

Dean Rogers acted as one of the judges in the Harvard-Princeton debate on March 26.

Edwin B. Gager, Professor of General Jurisprudence and Mortgages, has been nominated for re-appointment as judge of the Superior Court of Connecticut for a term of eight years, beginning July 1, 1909.

'75—Samuel O. Prentice of Hartford, Professor of Pleading in the Law School, has been nominated for re-appointment as justice of the Supreme Court of Connecticut, for a term of eight years from October 1, 1909.

'78—Robert B. Middlebrook has been appointed one of the police commissioners of Kansas City, Mo. The commissioners not only have control of the police department of the city, but also the exclusive power to grant or refuse liquor licenses.

'91—Charles H. Sherrill, of New York City, has been appointed envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary to Argentine Republic.

'95—Frederick M. Peasley of Waterbury has been named for deputy judge of the District Court of Waterbury for four years, from April 1 next, and has also been named for judge of the same court for four years from March 25, 1910.

'06—Herbert C. Lust has become associated with William Duff Hayne, for the general practice of law, under the firm name of Hayne & Lust, with offices in the Merchants' Loan & Trust Building, Chicago.
