EDWARD BISSELL, '53.

Judge Edward Bissell, '53, died October 21st at Fond du Lac, Wis. He was born at Litchfield, Conn., on Dec. 16, 1827, and was prepared for college by his own efforts. He was graduated from the New Milford, Conn., College in 1851, and from there entered the Yale Law School. After a short period of study in the law office of Gideon Hall, Jr., of Winsted, Conn., he removed to Fond du Lac, Wis., where he remained until his death. Mr. Bissell was elected in 1871, Municipal Court Judge of Fond du Lac. In his later life Judge Bissell was compelled by ill health to withdraw himself from the law and to confine himself to his business interests. Mr. Bissell was married on Sept. 5, 1864, to Miss Esther Hazen, a daughter of Elijah W. and Sarah Eliza Hazen, of New Haven, Conn. Judge Bissell is survived by one son, Edward Hazen Bissell.
